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Sharon Regional honored with Mission: Lifeline quality achievement award

Sharon Regional has received the Mission: Lifeline® Bronze Quality Achievement Award for implementing specific quality improvement measures outlined by the American Heart Association for the treatment of patients who suffer severe heart attacks.

Each year in the U.S., approximately 250,000 people have a STEMI, or ST-segment elevation myocardial infarction, caused by a complete blockage of blood flow to the heart that requires timely treatment. To prevent death, it's critical to immediately restore blood flow, either by surgically opening the blocked vessel or by giving clot-busting medication.

The American Heart Association's Mission: Lifeline program helps hospitals, emergency medical services and communities improve response times so people who suffer from a STEMI receive prompt, appropriate treatment. The program's goal is to streamline systems of care to quickly get heart attack patients from the first 9-1-1 call to hospital treatment.

"Sharon Regional is dedicated to improving the quality of care for our patients who suffer a heart attack, and the American Heart Association's Mission: Lifeline program is helping us accomplish that goal through internationally respected clinical guidelines," said John R. "Jack" Janoso, Jr., president and CEO. "We are pleased to be recognized for our dedication and achievements in cardiac care, and I am very proud of our team."

Sharon Regional earned the award by meeting specific criteria and standards of performance for the quick and appropriate treatment of STEMI patients to open the blocked artery. Before patients are discharged, they are started on aggressive risk reduction therapies such as cholesterollowering drugs, aspirin, ACE inhibitors and beta-blockers, and they receive smoking cessation counseling if needed. Eligible hospitals must adhere to these measures at a set level for a designated period to receive the awards.

Heart Attack Symptoms

Heart attacks affect all people differently—some people may have crushing or squeezing chest pain, nausea, and sweating. Other people may feel only mild sensations of tightness, fullness, shortness of breath, or feeling tired. Arm, jaw, neck, teeth and ear pain have all occurred when someone is having a heart attack.

Whatever the symptoms, don't delay, don't hope it will go away, call 9-1-1 and go to Sharon Regional's Emergency Care Center.

Sharon Regional was identified by EMMCO, West, Inc. as a STEMI hospital for Mercer, Lawrence, and Crawford counties based on its technology, emergency response capabilities, and physician specialists in emergency heart attack treatment.



Sharon Regional announces new hospitalist program

Sharon Regional Health System has started a new hospitalist program under the direction of Emmanuel Agwa, M.D.

Hospitalists are specially trained physicians who, at the request of a patient's primary care physician, will take over and coordinate care when the patient is in the hospital, while keeping the patient's primary care physician informed about their progress. Once the patient is discharged from the hospital, he/she returns once again to the care of their

primary care physician. Hospitalists also care for patients requiring inpatient stays as a result of an emergency room visit who do not have a primary care physician.

In recent years, many leading hospitals around the country have added hospitalists to their care teams. At Sharon Regional, some primary care physicians have indicated a desire to have hospitalists manage the care of their patients who need an inpatient admission, so they can devote more of their time to their busy

office practices. The hospitalist program also offers a solution for patients who want to choose Sharon Regional for their inpatient care, but who previously were unable to do so because their primary care physicians did not have admitting privileges at Sharon Regional.

Neshannock man and his parents choose Sharon Regional for heart and other services

"We have had nothing but wonderful experiences at Sharon Regional," says Jay Windl. "We've had no problems and always go to Sharon."

Jay, of Neshannock Township, Lawrence County, in the past year had several diagnostic tests at Sharon Regional, including a heart catheterization and endoscopic procedure. His parents, Gordon and Lois Lee, also of Neshannock, both had angioplasty (non-surgical opening of blocked heart vessels) procedures from Sharon Regional cardiologists in the past few years.

"Cardiologists at Sharon Regional saved my dad's life," Jay adds, "when they discovered heart blockages called the 'widow maker.' Dr. Ronnie Mignella (board certified interventional cardiologist) promptly performed an angioplasty and inserted several stents."

Other hospitals in Lawrence and Mercer counties must transfer their patients outside the area to have this procedure done.

A "widow maker" blockage of the left anterior coronary artery has all the signs of a standard heart attack and in fact has the same cause, i.e., a significant heart blockage. The distinction is in the severity and location of the blockage.

Gordon also had an endoscopic surgical procedure on another occasion at Sharon Regional to stop internal bleeding after complications from surgery at another hospital.

Personally, Jay touts his colonoscopy procedure to all his friends.

"I was
treated very well
by everyone in
the endoscopy
unit," says Jay.
"The anesthesia
I received was
wonderful. I woke up

after the procedure and had no problems. I know people who've had this test elsewhere and got sick from the anesthesia."

Sharon Regional adding \$3 million in capital improvements

Sharon Regional Health System is investing \$3 million in routine capital improvements over the next six months on new equipment and other upgrades as a result of the \$75 million capital commitment made through its recent affiliation with Community Health Systems (CHS) to advance facilities, services, and medical technology over the next five years.

This initial capital investment is focused on new equipment for patient care areas including a video tower upgrade for surgery, new medication scanners for the nursing units, new patient beds for both the Transitional Care Unit and Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit, and much more.

"I'm very happy for both our patients and staff to announce this investment into a number of upgrades here at Sharon Regional," said John R. "Jack" Janoso, Jr., president and CEO. "This assists in our goal of providing our patients with quality patient care as well as supporting the staff who deliver that care."

Sharon Regional is completing a strategic planning process to identify areas for growth, opportunities for recruiting additional primary care physicians and specialists, and to evaluate additional areas for capital improvements and enhancements.
