Sharon Regional strategic partnership, electronic medical records transition, and continued quality awards/recognitions highlight 2013

During 2013 Sharon Regional Health System's board of directors committed a major portion of its time and effort developing a process to explore potential partnership opportunities to determine if the best interests of the community would be served by Sharon Regional remaining independent or by pursuing some type of strategic partnership, as a number of healthcare organizations have done both nationally and regionally.

After months of thoughtful deliberation and discussion, the board on August 27 unanimously approved and executed a non-binding letter of intent that started the process of bringing to this region the strengths and resources of Community Health Systems (CHS), one of the largest and most successful healthcare organizations in the nation, along with the clinical program development and quality improvement expertise of the Cleveland Clinic. The process is expected to be completed in early 2014.

The affiliation with Community Health Systems will bring tremendous benefits to Sharon Regional and the region, including an infusion of significant capital for investments in facilities, services, and medical technology; continuation and growth of Sharon Regional's essential services (including medical/surgical, critical care, open heart and vascular surgery, emergency services, and obstetrics); the recruitment new primary care physicians and specialists to the community; access to charity and indigent care; and a local board of trustees comprised of Sharon Regional's

medical staff and local community leaders. It also guarantees economic stability for the community along with the preservation of choice for patients, physicians, and employers.

During 2013 Sharon Regional's heart program received an American College of Cardiology Platinum Achievement Award (one of only 197 hospitals nationwide) for a higher standard of care for heart attack patients. Other recognitions for Sharon Regional included an "A" hospital safety score from the Leapfrog Group, Level 1 VHA Mid-Atlantic APEX (Achieving Patient Care Excellence) award, and a Gold Star Quality Achievement award from United Healthcare.

The Health System completed the installation of its Cerner electronic medical records system and continued to grow through the expansion of services in both its Neshannock and Hubbard diagnostic and specialty centers.

Sharon Regional welcomed a number of new physicians during the past year including Mark Horvath, D.O., Keyur Patel, D.O., and Kellie Kirkpatrick, M.D., emergency medicine; John Schinner, D.O. and Stanislav Byshenko, M.D., family practice; Linet Ochweri, M.D., OB/GYN; James Boniface, M.D. and Matthew Stonestreet, M.D., orthopedics; Kate Paylo, M.D. and Tracy Neuendorf, D.O., pain management; Sandeep Riar, M.D., critical care; Sheetal Nijawan, M.D., bariatric and minimally invasive surgery; and Randon Simmons, M.D., psychiatry.

New Wilmington woman praises Sharon Regional breast surgeon

"He was great," says Marjorie Slonaker of Donald Keenan, M.D., Ph.D., breast surgeon at Sharon Regional. "Dr. Keenan is totally involved with you both as a patient and as a person. He makes sure everything is understood."

Marjorie was diagnosed with breast cancer about three years ago. She was undergoing an annual, follow-up examination at Sharon Regional's Cancer Care Center with George Garrow, M.D., medical oncology, after successful treatment for Hodgkin's lymphoma in 2005 while living in Virginia.

The new diagnosis led to a referral to Dr. Keenan at Sharon Regional's Breast Care Center, located in the Health System's Diagnostic & Imaging Center, 2435 Garden Way, Hermitage.

Diagnostic medical tests led to two surgeries later in 2011: a lengthy mastectomy and reconstruction procedure performed by Dr. Keenan and Michael White, M.D., plastic surgeon, at Allegheny General Hospital, Pittsburgh; and follow-up surgery by Dr. Keenan at Sharon Regional to remove some cancerous lymph nodes.

"Dr. Keenan's bedside manner is terrific," adds Marjorie. "He makes you feel like you're the only patient he has. I never felt like I was a just a number."

"The breast care staff and team of nurses helped me in every way possible. I couldn't have completed everything without their help."

After occupational rehabilitation at the Cancer Care Center, Marjorie, of New Wilmington, returned to work as a para professional in the Learning Support Department, grades K-3, in the Wilmington Area School District. Rehab addressed generalized pain, decreased endurance, weakness, and lymphedema that is common after cancer treatment.

Sharon Regional awarded an "A" grade by Hospital Safety Score

Sharon Regional was honored with an "A" grade in the 2013 update to the Hospital Safety ScoreSM, which rates how well hospitals protect patients from accidents, errors, injuries, and infections. The Hospital Safety Score is compiled under the guidance of the nation's leading experts on patient safety and is administered by The Leapfrog Group (Leapfrog), an independent industry watchdog. The first and only hospital safety rating to be analyzed in the peerreviewed Journal of Patient Safety, the Score is designed to give the public information they can use to protect themselves and their families. "As patients begin to take a more active role in selecting where to receive health care, it has never been more important to focus on hospital safety and transparency. The "A" hospitals, including Sharon Regional Health System, are helping us to raise the standards of health care nationwide," said Leah Binder, president

and CEO of Leapfrog. "We offer our congratulations and hope the hospital will continue to strive for an ever-increasing level of excellence in patient safety."

To see Sharon Regional's scores as they compare nationally and locally, and to find safety tips for patients and their loved ones, visit the Hospital Safety Score website at www.hospitalsafetyscore.org.

Calculated under the guidance of The Leapfrog Group's Blue Ribbon Expert Panel, the Hospital Safety Score uses 28 measures of publicly available hospital safety data to produce a single "A," "B," "C," "D," or "F" score representing a hospital's overall capacity to keep patients safe from preventable harm. More than 2,500 general U.S. hospitals were assigned scores this Fall. A full analysis of the data and methodology used is available on the Hospital Safety Score website.

"I'm extremely proud of our physicians, employees, and other staff whose dedication and hard work produced this "A" Hospital Safety Score," said John R. "Jack" Janoso, Jr., president and CEO of Sharon Regional.

"We've noticed a significant increase in the last several years in awards and recognitions from independent sources like The Leapfrog Group, and this is a real plus for those who choose Sharon Regional for their care."

Kim Stephenson, RN, LCCE, is a Lamaze Certified Childbirth Educator (LCCE) who is teaching prepared childbirth classes for the Women's Center. She is also the Healthy Beginnings Plus Care Coordinator for Family Planning Services of Mercer County and a certified Parent to Parent facilitator.

Childbirth classes are designed for the "Mom-To-Be" and her support person in the second half of pregnancy. The series of four classes concludes with a tour of the Women's Center. Childbirth education classes give expectant parents information about the natural childbirth process.

Sharon Regional's goal is to give families the knowledge to help them make choices for a personalized birth experience. Participants are encouraged to become active participants in all aspects of their health care.

Class participants have the opportunity to try the breathing, relaxation, and positioning techniques that are presented in lectures, written materials, and videos. We want to help mom and her support person to find "what is going to work best for them."

"We encourage questions," Kim says.

"Our classes provide a wide array of information pertaining to pregnancy, childbirth, postpartum, and newborn care. It is a privilege to be involved in the birth of a child. Attention to the parents' unique concerns is a priority for me in meeting their educational needs."

"Our classes are informal. We promote a relaxed atmosphere that includes group activities, games, conversation, snacks, and hopefully, a little laughter to make the learning process more enjoyable."
